Integrity Standards of VAP

4th Party Audit Quality Manager (AQM) oversight





Available for Factories who successfully complete a VAP, and verify closure of applicable Findings

Recognized with a certificate valid for 2 years from last day of initial audit

✓ Must be VAP Audit

- ✓ CAP managed in RBA Online
- ✓ If Priority Findings in Forced Labor or Child Labor, site subject to an unannounced re-audit over the next 12 months

Procurement Requirements

When public buyers add social and environmental requirements to a bid, the brand and the supply chain must meet these requirements... If they want the business



Quality, Price and Delivery

The foundation of all procurement bids include quality, price and delivery. There is no compromise on these elements with buyers across the world and framework agreements and contracts reflect this.

Social and Environmental Responsibility

Buyers across Europe are no longer willing to see social and environmental responsibility as a nice-to-have, but instead, are adding it to framework agreements and contracts like other nonnegotiable elements of the bid.

Transparency

In order for buyers to have confidence that the products they are buying are made in a socially and environmentally friendly way, there needs to be <u>meaningful transparency</u>.



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The RBA Code of Conduct covers all material elements of the public procurement framework agreements across Europe. The VAP and VAP Recognition Program are accepted in multiple countries as evidence of compliance and due diligence in the supply chain. The RBA Membership compliance and accountability system supports the buyers advancing expectations on responsible business conduct.

Public buyers need a way to assess their supply chain at the factory level. The RBA has data on thousands of factories which are in the supply chain of public buyers.



Public Procurement across Europe expect worker monitoring as part of a robust due diligence system. The RBA is piloting worker voice options globally and will expand that over time.
